Thank you for your continued support in making The Roseland Academy a place where all our students can feel proud, connected and ready to achieve.



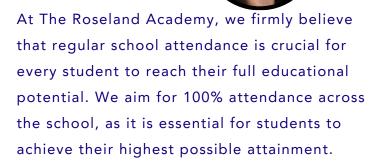




ATTENDANCE MATTERS

THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

While we understand that occasional illness may prevent attendance, our minimum expectation is that all students attend school at least 96% of the time. This ensures they can fully participate in learning and avoid disruption to their progress and that of others.

Parents and Carers have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly. Missing school not only harms academic performance but also disrupts school routines and impacts the learning environment for everyone. At The Roseland Academy, we are committed to improving overall attendance and reducing Persistent Absence (below 90%).

How does attendance affect outcomes for students?

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE results.

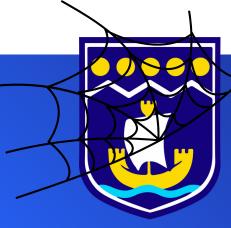
What are the risks of missing a day of school?

Every moment in school counts and days missed add up quickly. For example, a child in Year 10 who is absent for three days over a half term could miss 15 lessons in total.

The higher a student's attendance, the more they are likely to learn and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments.

What You Can Do:

- Call the school before 9:15 am each day that your child is absent.
- Inform the school in advance of any medical appointments and provide appointment cards or letters.
- If you are unsure whether your child is well enough to attend, send them in – children often improve once they arrive at school.
- Have a backup plan for transport issues, such as asking a family member, neighbour or friend for help.
- If you're facing difficulties with attendance, speak to us early so we can offer support.

By working together, we can help ensure that your child makes the most of their time at school and achieves their very best.

What We Will Do:

- Monitor your child's attendance daily.
- Contact you by phone if we have concerns about your child's attendance.
- Invite you for attendance meetings if necessary.
- Make a home welfare visit if we cannot establish a reason for ongoing absence.

This focused intervention has historically been very effective in preparing students for their final assessments. We appreciate your efforts in supporting and encouraging your child's participation in both the preparation and the follow-up support.

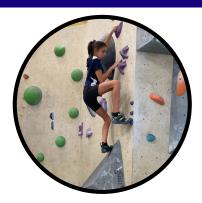






SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

Matt Windle Poet with a Punch!'



We were delighted to welcome Matt Windle – Poet with a Punch – to The Roseland Academy this September.





Matt is not only a professional boxer and former Commonwealth light-flyweight champion, but also a three-time Birmingham Poet Laureate.

Matt delivered a series of highenergy workshops to Year 9 that
combined the creativity of poetry
with the discipline and
determination of boxing. His poems
explore themes of resilience,
ambition and identity – mixing
sharp rhythm and rhyme with
powerful imagery. Students heard
lines where Matt compared the
discipline of the ring to the
courage it takes to stand up and
speak, and verses that turned the
beat of a skipping rope into the
rhythm of self-belief.

Students created their own verses on nature and ambition, experimenting with rhyme, repetition and performance. One group wrote about the "fight inside" when facing challenges at school, while another compared stepping onto the pitch to stepping into the ring.

The atmosphere around school was electric, with students brimming with new ideas and inspiration. As one student put it "He showed us that poetry can hit just as hard as a punch.". We're excited to see how students continue to channel this creativity in the weeks ahead.
